## How to Manage Division in the Church By Bob Young

La motivation for developing this outline was a letter received from a brother in Christ. What follows is only a brief study outline, but one can use it to organize the principle points and then add details, examples, etc. (Where the brother lives is not important—the problem exists almost everywhere.) "Greetings, brother, I remember you fondly and the counsel you gave me concerning division in the church. Please, I need some Bible verses that speak about division in the church and what would be the best way to restore unity."

## Recognize that division is not consistent with the purpose of God

- God desires unity within the church, among his people, 1 Cor. 1; Eph. (esp. 4:1-16); Phil. 2:1-5
- John 17:1-23

## Identify the cause of the division

- Is it personal/personalities, doctrinal, preferences?
- We must come to agreement about the cause; only then can we apply the correct verses
- "We have disagreed on the basis of personal preferences and called it doctrinal."
- Divisions that are genuinely doctrinal will require a change of heart on the part of one or both parties
- If doctrinal agreement cannot be reached, division/separation will likely be necessary
- All other sources/causes of divisions should result in restored fellowship, Rom. 14:1ff

## Seek to resolve the conflict/division

- Restoration is focused first on helping everyone walk faithfully with the Lord
- Restoration must also focus on the health of the local church
- All must maintain a proper spirit, Eph. 4:1-2; Gal. 6:1-2
- Even when disagreements are based in personal opinion, it may at times be necessary that the two parties/groups go their separate ways (Paul-Barnabas, Acts 15)
- The Bible says we must mark those who have the divisive spirit, those who cause divisions, Rom. 16:17
