Recapping; Finishing 2024 with a Flourish

Spring 2024. As Jan and I sought to find a new rhythm in this mission work, 2024 travels started out slow in comparison to years past. The first four months included one international mission trip, two stateside mission trips, and a planning retreat. The slowdown in travel was more than offset by a flurry of online classes, presentations, and Bible studies, coupled with meetings to incorporate new mission partners, mentoring sessions, teaching the Wednesday Early Bird class at Fort Gibson, and helping with the annual mission emphasis at Fort Gibson.

Summer 2024. Travels found me in Ecuador, Colombia, and the Dominican Republic (see June-July newsletter for details). In late summer, Jan and I made an extended stateside trip for preaching, reporting and fund-raising contacts. In late summer, the final production details for the publication of the "Knowing Jesus" video series were completed with a dedicated YouTube channel, a new Facebook page, and study resources available online (see details in August newsletter and brief update below).

Fall 2024. I share our upcoming schedule so you can pray specifically for the mission work. Plans for the last three months include Mission Sunday efforts in Oklahoma and Arkansas, the international conference of Spanish-speaking church leaders in Nashville (TN), a weekend series in Florida with a multi-ethnic church, and Baxter graduation. Pray also for the works mentioned below in this newsletter. **We appreciate your prayers**.

Ecuador Update

Since January 2024, Latin American Leadership Development has provided support for a series of equipping visits in Tulcán, Ecuador (picture right, a weekend presentation during my visit in May). Transportation reimbursement has been provided for brothers who have traveled every week from Ibarra to share Bible studies and training.

The studies and training have focused on dealing with division and disagreements, lack of commitment, and the need for holy lives. Thankfully, the church has exhibited a great desire to study the word of God, with attendance at the studies and training at about the same level as Sunday morning attendance.

The studies have resulted in the baptisms of four youth and an adult. The church is more unified and more committed to participating in area events with other churches of Christ. For the rest of the year, studies will focus on the organization of the church, the importance of good works, and leadership development. With candidates who could serve as elders and evangelists, **pray that the church will be able to develop biblical leadership** and to move forward toward greater kingdom service. **Thank you for your prayers!**



Exciting things are happening and getting ready to happen in the Dominican Republic! God is blessing the work of faithful brothers and sisters.

In October, build teams from Liberté Ministries will travel to the Dominican Republic (D.R.) with the goal of completing two more church buildings—at Los Cocos in Neyba and at Postrer Rio. **Pray for safety and success for**



the brothers who are part of this Alabama group. (A summary of the trip will be included in the next newsletter.)

In June, I traveled to the D.R. with Arvy Dupuy and Jay Gregory to help acquaint them with the work (picture left, Jay, Bob, and Arvy). Liberté Ministries has worked in Haiti for many years, but that country is currently closed. A logical extension of the work in Haiti is to help with the needs of Haitian refugees who have fled their country and are now part of

Colombia Update

Online platforms like Zoom, Facebook Live, and YouTube Live have been a blessing in the development of the mission works. Online virtual



meetings often have 30-50 participants (picture left, sample of advertising used in

Bogota for an online series of lessons).

Advancing the work in southern Colombia, the Holmes Road church in Lansing (MI) has committed to continuing to help with

the church redevelopment effort in La Hormiga, Putumayo, Colombia.

Most of the support for an evangelist in southern Colombia is being provided by two families, with LALD making up the difference. (Picture right, the evangelist and his wife, Jairo and Andrea, with Mitch Whittington and your servant, during our May visit).

Cajamarca, Perú Update



The new church plant in downtown Cajamarca is slowly gaining a foothold, developing relationships with those contacted and becoming more visible in the city (picture left). The rented location is very near the very center of downtown, about half a block from a major traffic circle. Church planting work that depends on only

one family is often difficult and lonely. **Pray for Raul Chumbile and his wife** in this work.

Another work, Santa Úrsula, is about 45 minutes away. The possibilities in downtown Cajamarca can be seen in the attendance at a recent conference hosted in Santa Úrsula (picture right).
