Organizing grammatical constructions in the book of James

One way to understand the organization to an epistolary text is to look for terms of address (in Greek, these would be vocative case). These may be of two kinds.

- Direct (brothers, my brothers), perhaps to all readers?
- Indirect, (you....), to a subset of the readers?

One may also notice "companion instructions," which often appear in an "if/when....." format. These occur only in the first half of the book.

The following list is correlated to a topical list which reflects a possible chiastic construction in the book.
