Hermeneutics

- 1. Interpret individual passage in light of the overall context, motto, purpose, setting, themes.
 - Use a concordance to understand the unique wisdom language context, understand the "collection of collections"
- 2. Recognize literary forms and devices
 - Admonition and imperative--wisdom sentence is in indicative mood, 12:4
 - The torah in Proverbs is usually not Moses' Torah, but is usually parental
- 3. Beware of idea that proverbs are unconditional promises, some proverbs have limits
- 4. Some proverbs are unconditionally true, 16:2; 12:33; 11:1; 12:22; 15:3
- 5. Interpret Proverbs in the historical-cultural context of extra-biblical wisdom literature

Homiletics

- 1. Apply Proverbs—validate the text through the rest of the Bible (10:22)
- 2. Utilize the nature and character of Proverbs to communicate graphic principles
- 3. Explain the creative use of proverbial characters (26:14)
